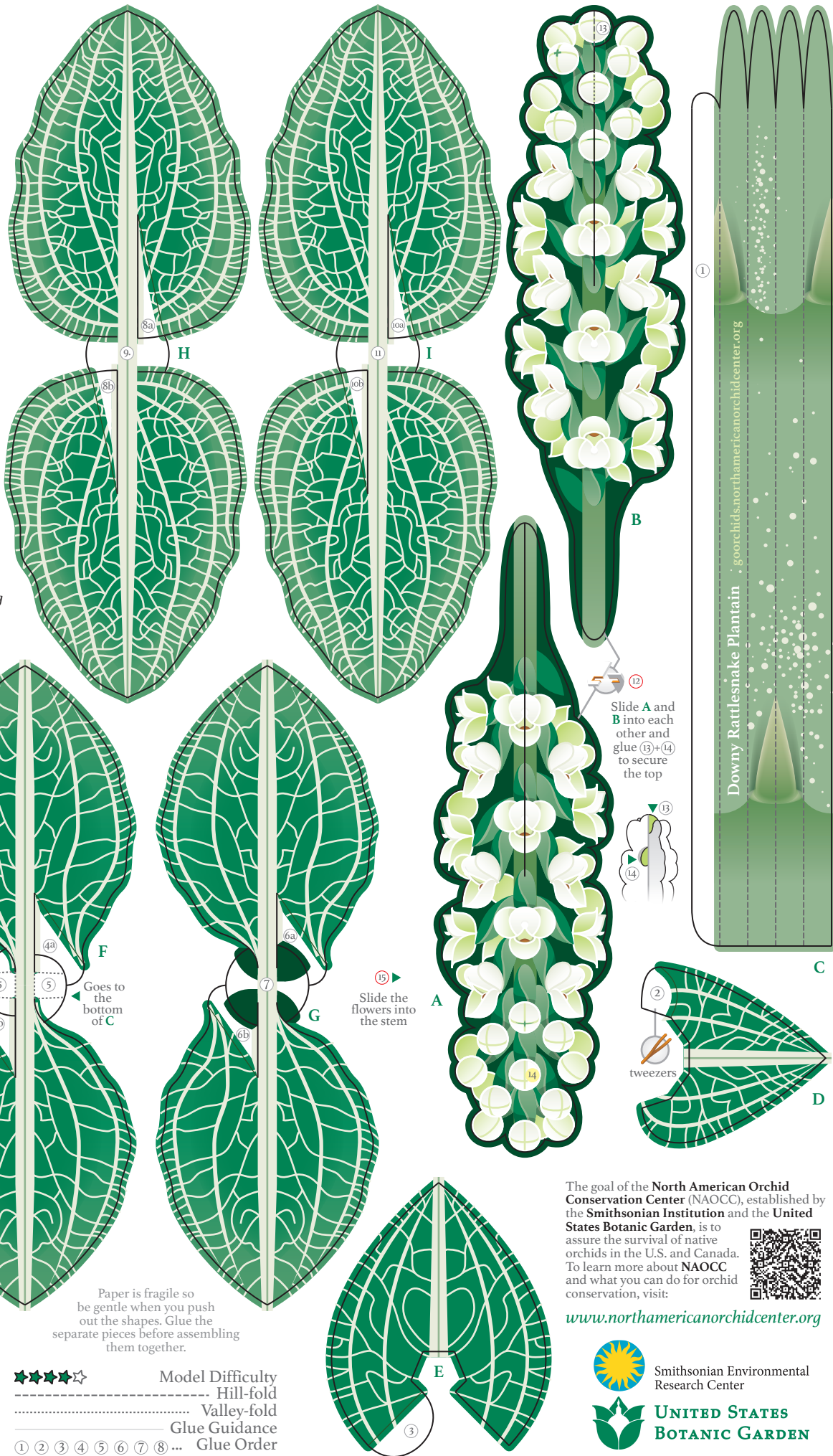

Goodyera pubescens Downy Rattlesnake Plantain

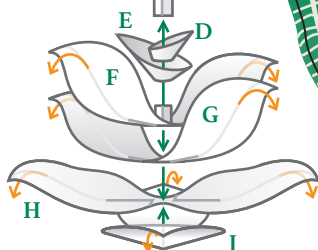


This evergreen orchid (it has leaves throughout the year) is easy to spot in the forests of eastern North America. The veined leaves form a rosette in winter,
